

isolation, affecting wellbeing and personal relationships. Funds received in 2014 through the Novus Foundation will be used to support a new Inclusive, Interactive and Augmentative training program for young adults with disabilities. The aim of the program is to

teach the participating youth to use technology for improved communication, removing barriers towards independence and inclusion.
